STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- · Meet with your major advisor and IA Advisor at least once a semester and prior to registration (or when needed)
- Recognize when you need help, seek assistance, and ask questions
- Take an active role in your advising session by coming prepared with questions
- Be open and willing to consider advice from faculty, advisors, and other mentors
- Be aware of college/university policies and procedures
- · Seek knowledge about your major, campus resources, career aspirations, and growth Year Planning
- Seek advising prior to advanced registration
- Resolve all holds **prior** to advanced registration
