Dear Friends of the UF Innovation Academy,

I am pleased to share the 2024–2025 Innovation Academy Annual Report and to celebrate another remarkable year of growth, creativity, and collaboration across our community. This year marked a milestone as the Innovation Academy officially moved into its new home on the third floor of the Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) building. The new McGrogan Active Learning Center, Startup Springs, and our state-of-the-art Prototyping Studio now provide dynamic spaces for our students to dream, design, and build. These spaces reflect the very essence of our mission, empowering innovative students to bring their ideas to life.

Our academic programs continued to expand in both depth and reach. From the study abroad program in Maynooth, Ireland, to growing partnerships with the Cade Museum, San Felasco Tech City, the City of Alachua, and Space Florida, our students engaged in over 260 design thinking projects across all IA courses this year. We also saw a record number of students participating in internships, with 28 students collaborating on local projects that made a measurable impact on our Gainesville community.

The IA faculty continued innovating in their classrooms by integrating artificial intelligence tools for ideation, design, and feedback while contributing to research, publications, and professional development initiatives. Their dedication ensures our curriculum remains at the cutting edge of innovation in higher education. Our advising team guided more than 5,200 student interactions through appointments, email advising, and workshops, achieving an outstanding 99% retention rate for the most recent cohort. These numbers reflect our commitment to student success and cultivating a culture of curiosity, support and student success.

Beyond the classroom, our community continues to inspire innovation. Each month, the Trailblazers student recognition program highlights exceptional student innovators, and our Summit ceremonies brought alumni back to share their journeys, reminding our students that innovation is not just an academic pursuit but a lifelong mindset.

As we look ahead, the Innovation Academy remains grounded in its mission to prepare innovative leaders. The partnerships we've built, the projects we've launched, and the spaces we've designed all reinforce that innovation is thriving at the University of Florida. Thank you to our faculty, staff, students, and partners who make this community what it is. Together, we continue to ideate, create, iterate and innovate.

Academic Achievements

During the 2024-2025 academic year, the University of Florida's Innovation Academy advanced its hands-on, design thinking-based curriculum through expanded use of AI tools, strong local and global partnerships, and enhanced student engagement. Over 1,000 innovation projects were completed across core courses including Innovation Mindset, Creativity & Design Thinking for Innovation, Innovation in Action, and Senior Project, with students collaborating on real-world challenges alongside partners such as the Cade Museum, City of Alachua, San Felasco Tech City, and Space Florida. Technical Assistants supported more than 2,500 student consultations, strengthening prototype development and technical skills. Faculty achievements included advanced degrees, research publications, and participation in AI-focused professional development. Through innovative teaching strategies, feedback systems, and community collaboration, the Innovation Academy continued to foster creativity, interdisciplinary learning, and professional readiness among its students.

IA Move

In 2025, the Innovation Academy officially moved from the Infirmary building to its new home on the third floor of the Computer Science and Engineering building (CSE), right next to Marston Science Library and near the Century Tower. The CSE has been undergoing major renovations to create new spaces, one of them now a dedicated suite for the Innovation Academy. Highlights of the redesign include new classrooms like the McGrogan Active Learning Center, the Startup Springs student business incubator, and the Prototyping Studio equipped with brand new 3D printers. The new space is meant to inspire creativity and collaboration, encouraging IA students to bring their ideas to life.











At the beginning of each Spring semester, IA invites its newest cohort of students to campus with a prestigious convocation ceremony. All first-year IA students, along with their guests, are welcomed by university leadership, the IA team, college advisors and fellow Gator innovators. The newest cohort began their IA journey with encouraging messages from the IA sophomore speaker, Jordan Im, and keynote, Bradley Gamble—CEO of the Cade Museum for Creativity and Invention. The warm welcome continued with a friends and family reception while IA students met with their college advisors.



After five weeks of preparation, first-year IA Students in the Innovation in Action course presented their ideas, prototypes, informational posters, and persuasive pitches at Catalyst in either a summer A or summer B semester. Members of the community, family, friends, fellow innovators, and people passionate about innovation attended this momentous event. Unlike previous years, each semester had a unique challenge. Summer A's challenge was developed in partnership with San Felasco Tech City: "How might we design a dynamic pedestrian friendly roundabout in Tech Town that invites exploration, highlights emerging technologies and artwork, and captivates visitors through engaging and active experiences?" And Summer B's statement engaged the nearby city of Alachua: "How might we reimagine a downtown Alachua city block to celebrate its unique history and charm, while creating a vibrant, modern hub where residents, merchants, and visitors can live, work, and play?"Awards for six categories at each semester were given to winning teams, including a cash prize for the overall Judges' Choice awardees, donated by Mitch Glaeser from Emory Group.



Every spring and summer, the Innovation Academy celebrates and honors graduating students for their dedication to driving change through innovation. Summit is the Innovation Academy's Award Ceremony, in which eligible IA seniors receive their Innovation Medallion; a symbol of commitment to their professional development that highlights their unique academic achievement.
